**James: Faith that Works**—this Sunday we continue the five-week sermon series on the book of James. Through history, James' work has been a source of controversy because salvation is by grace through faith, not because of our own accomplishments. But James teaches us what faith that works looks like. This will be a great opportunity for us to think deeply about how we should live out our faith!

Mike McAfee is collecting coats for the homeless again this year. If you have new or used winter coats that you would like to donate and will put them in the closet in the Gathering Point, they will be picked up, periodically, and distributed.
